

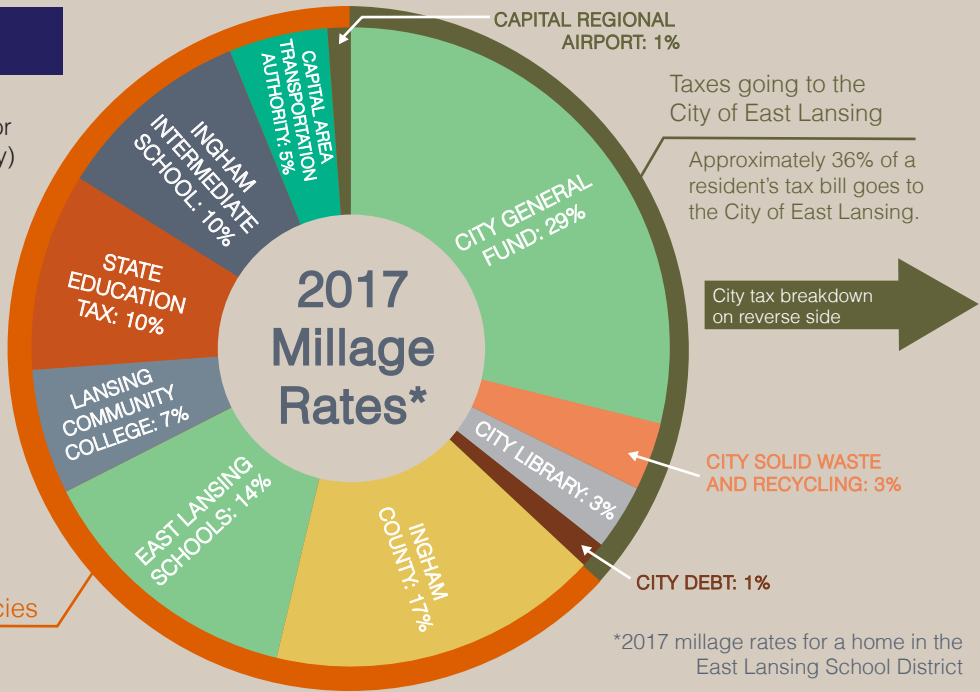
# Where do my property taxes go?

Have you ever wondered where your property taxes go? The numbers below break down the distribution of taxes for a home in the East Lansing School District (Ingham County) with a taxable value of \$100,000.

Taxable Value of Home	\$100,000
2017 Tax Millage Rate (summer & winter)	60.0410
<b>Total Taxes</b>	<b>\$6,004.10</b>

Taxes distributed to Other Agencies	\$3,785.59
Taxes kept by the City	\$2,218.51

Amount to City General Fund	\$1,756.79
Amount to City Solid Waste	\$182.50
Amount to City Library	\$199.76
Amount to City Debt	\$79.46
<b>Total</b>	<b>\$2,218.51</b>



## How are my property taxes used by the City of East Lansing?

Using the same example from the front - a home with a taxable value of \$100,000 - the numbers below show how taxes kept by the City (approximately 36% of a resident's bill) are used.

### General Government

Human Resources, City Council, Communications & Cable Services, City Attorney, 54B District Court, Finance, City Clerk, City Manager, Government Buildings **\$246.13**

### Recreation and Culture

Parks Maintenance, General Fund Support for Seniors' Program and Parks and Recreation (i.e. recreational facilities & programming, community events) **\$171.49**

### Capital Improvements/Debt

City facility and park improvements, debt for facilities **\$98.45**

### Public Safety

Police, Fire and Building & Housing **\$1,147.03**

### Community & Economic Development

Planning, Zoning, Social Services **\$55.15**

### General Public Works

Admin, Engineering, Sidewalks, Alleys, Drains, Street Lighting, Downtown Maintenance **\$118.00**

### Rubbish and Recycling

**\$182.50**

### Library

**\$199.76**
