Dear Resident/Property Owner:

This is to provide advance notification that roadway construction work will begin in your neighborhood area soon. These improvements are part of an ongoing program to improve the infrastructure throughout the City. The contractor for the project is Michigan Paving & Materials Companies of Lansing, Michigan. Construction is anticipated to begin on July 10, 2019 on M.A.C. Ave. and then progress to the remaining target streets afterwards. See the reverse side for a map of the impacted areas.

During various stages of construction, the streets will be closed to through traffic but shall remain open to residents. However, since the construction activity may involve replacing the road surface, curbing, and drive approaches, it may not always be possible to maintain access to driveways. You will receive future notifications should access to your driveway be disrupted. At such times, please park your car on adjacent side streets out of the way of construction activities. Please understand that you may be redirected from one end of the street or the other at various times, to complete the scheduled improvements within the roadway. Residents who have access to alternate routes of travel are asked to do so during the project duration.

Refuse collection and mail delivery will not be disrupted during construction and, unless notified otherwise, all rubbish should be placed at or near the curb in the normal manner. Please have all refuse and recycling containers out by 7:30 AM on your collection day as City crews will be in this area early to avoid conflicts with road reconstruction crews.

Street lighting in your area may also be impacted during construction. Due to the proximity of the underground electric cables to the construction activities, the street lights in your area may be turned off to protect the construction personnel performing the work. The street lights will be reenergized as soon as the construction progresses to a stage where the utility company can safely reinstall the wires and restore power to them.

Property Owners are responsible for invisible underground fencing and sprinkler systems placed within the street right-of-way. The City would ask that property owners clearly mark these systems with flags or stakes to show their location. The contractor shall make every effort to avoid these private systems during construction, however, if they are damaged by construction activities, the property owner must bear the expense of repairing or replacing them.

We realize the construction work will be inconvenient and disrupt normal routines. However, your understanding and cooperation with the City's efforts to improve the streets in your neighborhood is greatly appreciated. The City will provide a project inspector who will be in the area daily to address any problems that may arise.

If you have any questions or have any special needs or concerns, please contact the East Lansing Engineering Department. I would ask that you email me if you wish to be included in general updates during the project, to keep you better informed of progress and schedule. 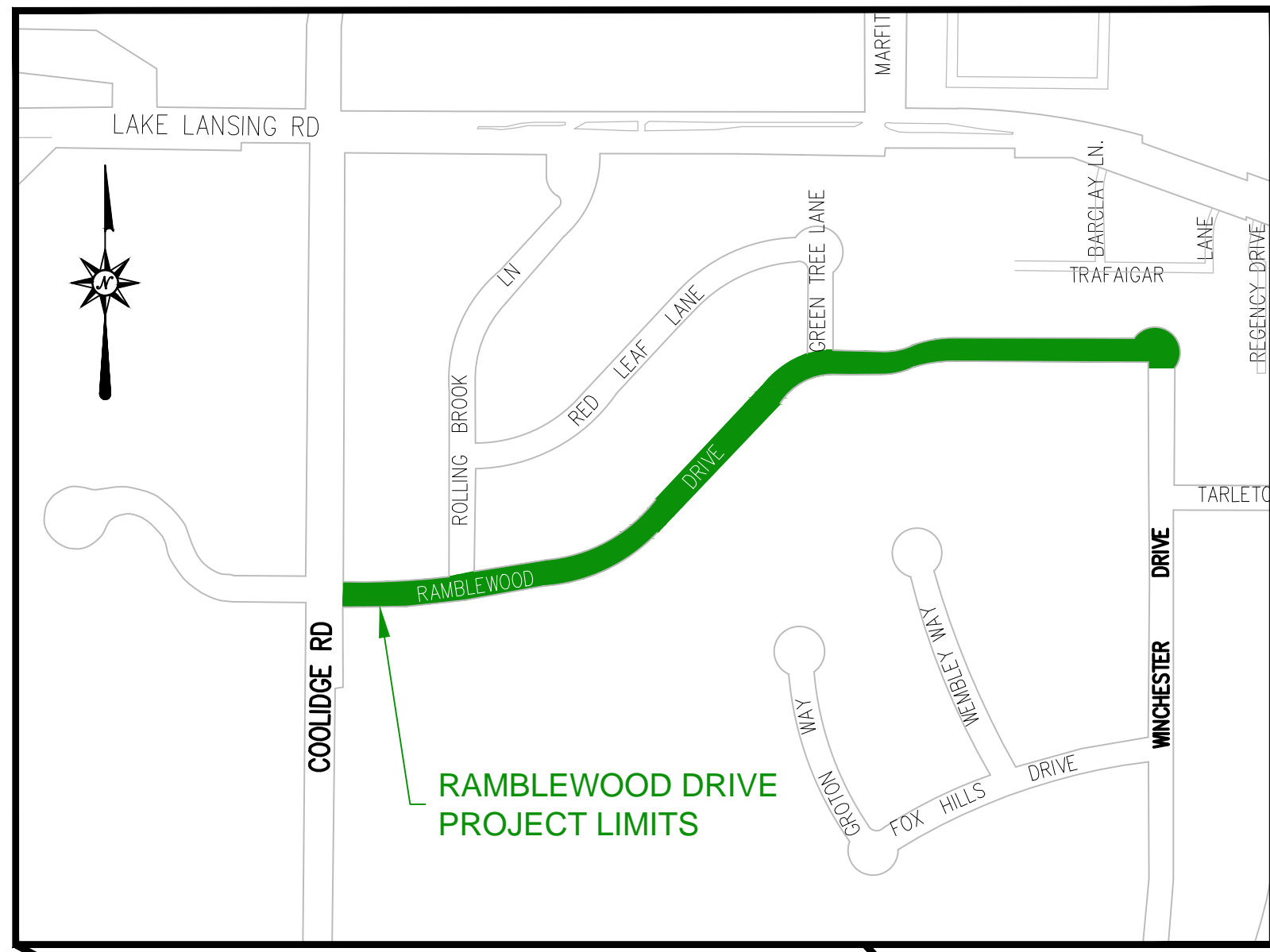

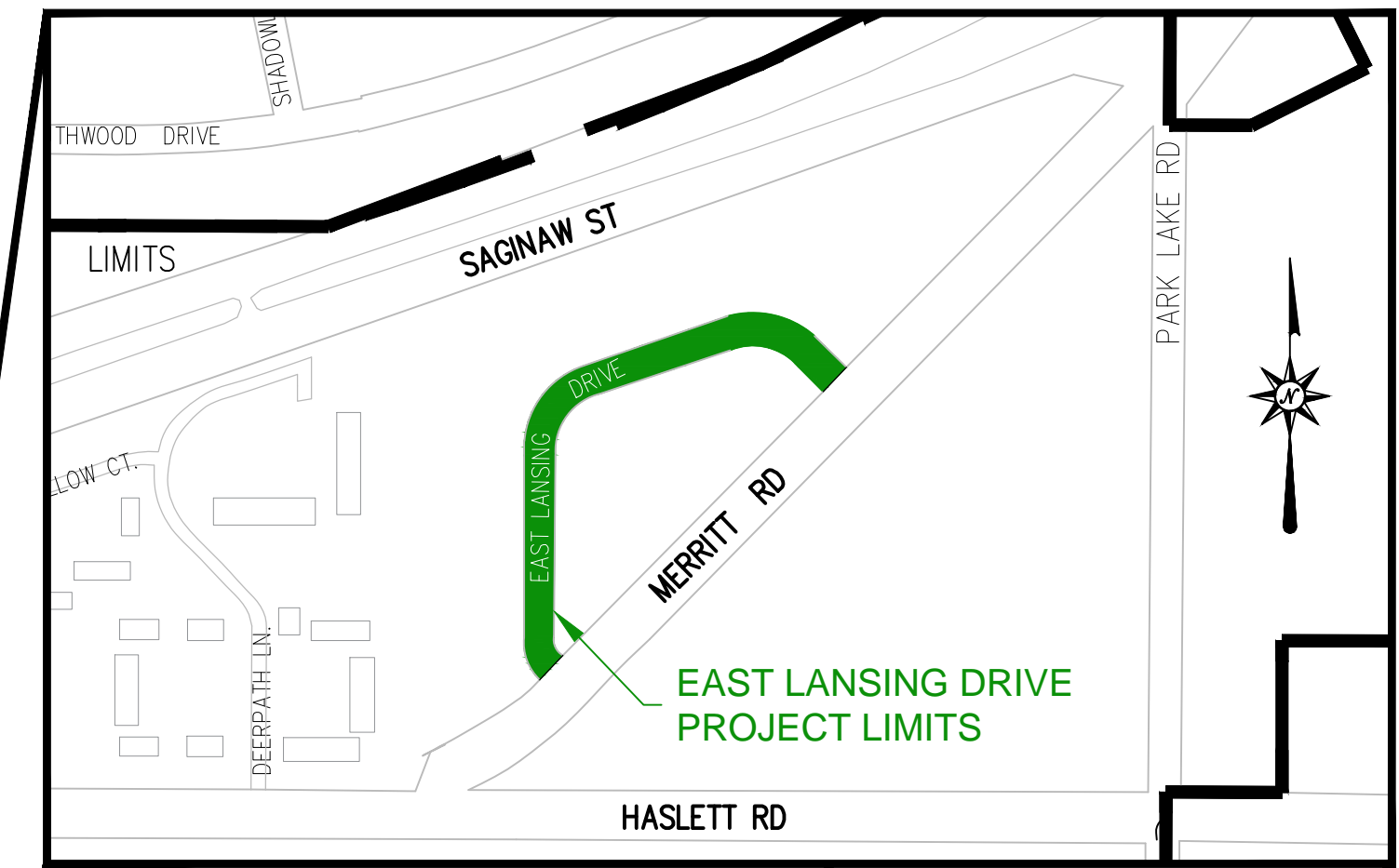
**RAMBLEWOOD DRIVE
(COOLIDGE RD. TO WINCHESTER DR.)**



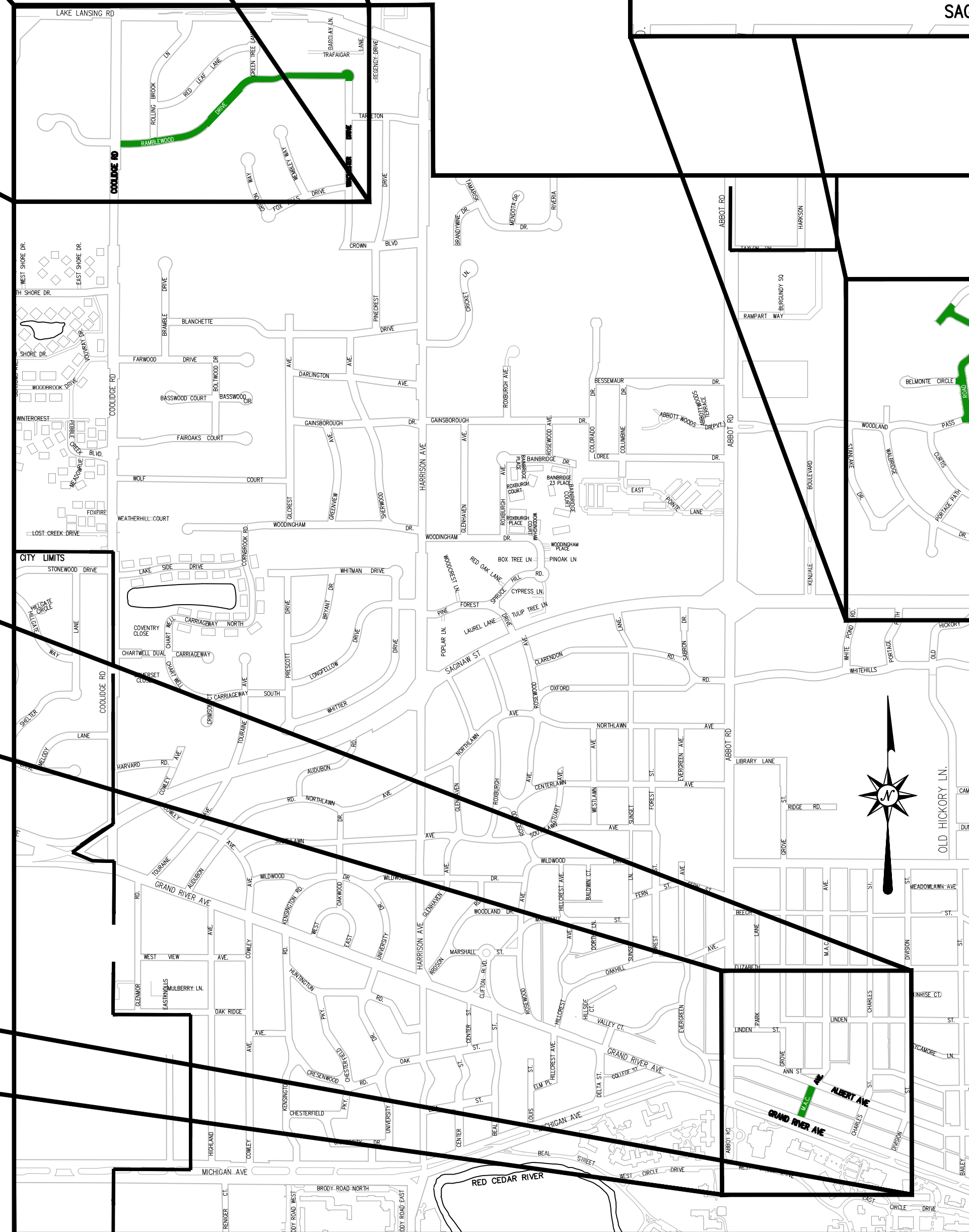
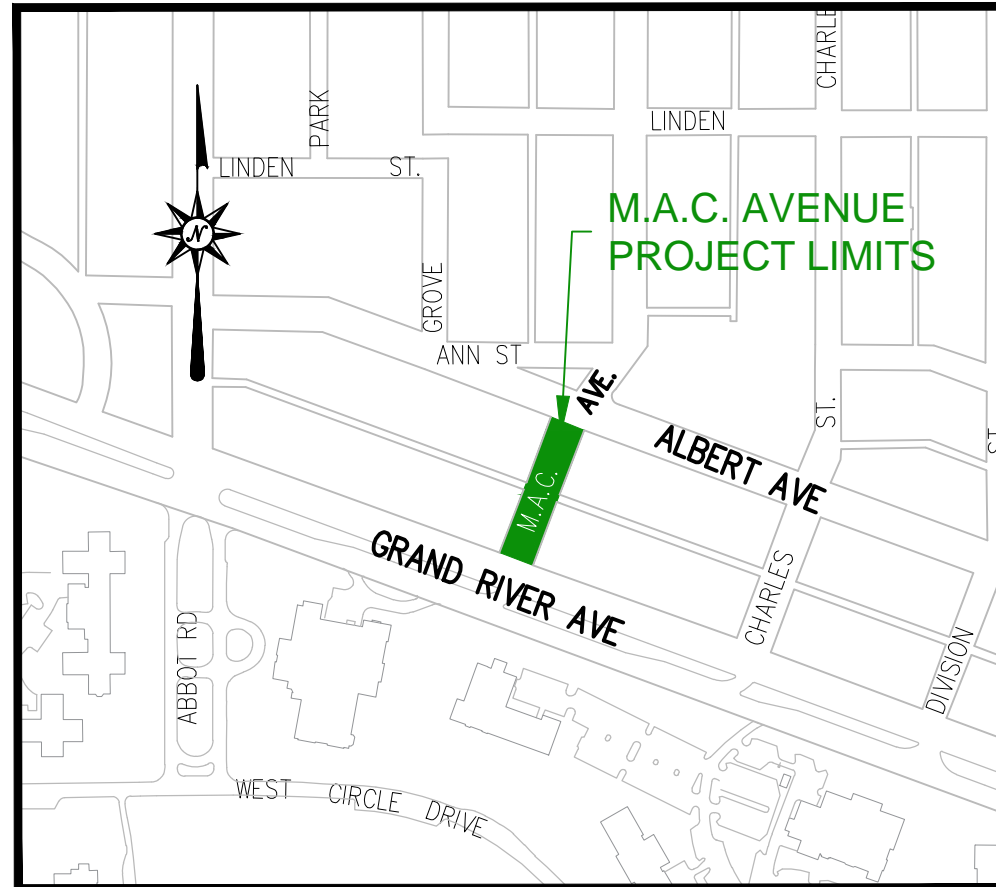
**HITCHING POST ROAD & OLD MILL ROAD
